The SLSO's IN UNISON program is a multi-faceted initiative founded in 1992. It includes partnerships between the orchestra and local African American churches, a chorus specializing in music of African and African American origins, and the IN UNISON Academy, dedicated to assisting young musicians achieve their musical and academic aspirations.

Each season, the IN UNISON program makes a meaningful impact on the St. Louis region...

- **9,000+** students, church partners, choral singers, & listeners participate
- **3 IN UNISON Chorus concerts**, including 1 free community concert
- **8 performances** in partner churches
- **5 performances championing works of Florence Price**, recognized as the first African American woman symphonic composer
- **120 IN UNISON Chorus members**
- **6 IN UNISON Young Artists under 30** receive stipends to rehearse and perform with the chorus
- **6 Delores Greathouse Scholarships** awarded to students pursuing undergraduate degrees & participating in a musical ensemble
- **16 Mentoring the Music:** Peer-to-Peer students matched with Youth Orchestra members and SLSO musicians for music development beyond the classroom
- **IN UNISON Graduate Fellow** working on staff at the SLSO
