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## ST. LOUIS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA WELCOMES FAMILIES, CONNECTS CULTURES THROUGH FAMILY CONCERT FEATURING MUSIC FROM AROUND THE WORLD, OCTOBER 6

## SLSO Resident Conductor Gemma New leads multicultural music experience designed for families

(September 23, 2019, St. Louis, MO) – The St. Louis Symphony Orchestra will welcome families and connect them with cultures from around the world in its Music Without Boundaries Family Concert at 3:00pm, Sunday, October 6, 2019. Presented in partnership with the World Traveler Gallery at <u>The Magic House</u>, the Music Without Boundaries concert is designed to take families on a musical journey illustrating the influence of music from international cultures including the Balkans, France, Latin American, and West Africa.

Led by SLSO <u>Resident Conductor Gemma New</u>, the SLSO will be joined by Matthew Henry and the University of Missouri-St. Louis Percussion Ensemble and accordionist Amir Salisevic, who will perform music of his native Bosnia and Herzegovina.

This is the SLSO's first Family Concert of the 2019/2020 season. <u>The SLSO's Family Concert series</u> captures the imaginations of younger listeners while making orchestral concerts accessible to families with young children. SLSO Family Concerts are usually 45 minutes long with no intermission – making them a great introductory experience for young patrons and families. This season, New and the SLSO will lead families on two other musical adventures: Peter and the Wolf (February 23, 2020) and the World of Water (April 19, 2020).

Attendees are encouraged to arrive early to explore the SLSO's Instrument Playground, an interactive experience by the <u>St. Louis Symphony Volunteer Association</u> for children of all ages to learn about and play the instruments of the orchestra. The Magic House will be on hand to help families create couplets – red paper squares with Chinese characters traditionally used as decorations during celebrations.
