ST. LOUIS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA MUSIC DIRECTOR STÉPHANE DENÈVE LEADS OPENING CONCERTS OF 2021/2022 CLASSICAL SEASON, SEPTEMBER 19-OCTOBER 2

On September 19, Denève, Assistant Conductor Stephanie Childress, and the orchestra preview the season with an hourlong concert of selections from the entire 21/22 season; all tickets are \$15

On September 25-26, Denève opens the classical season with the first SLSO performances of Jessie Montgomery's *Banner* and Anna Clyne's *DANCE*, which features cellist Inbal Segev and choreography by Kirven Douthit-Boyd, along with Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 4

On October 1-2, Denève leads the SLSO premiere of Caroline Shaw's *Entr'acte*, as well as performances of Charles Ives' *The Unanswered Question*, Christopher Rouse's *Rapture*, and Sergei Rachmaninoff's Piano Concerto No. 3, performed by pianist Yefim Bronfman in his return to the SLSO

(August 24, 2021, St. Louis, MO) – Today, the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra announced details of the first classical concerts in the 2021/2022 season, the orchestra's 142nd, led by Music Director Stéphane Denève.

All tickets for the September 19 preview concert are \$15. Tickets for all classical concerts begin at \$15. To purchase tickets, call the SLSO Box Office at 314-534-1700 or visit slso.org.

The season preview concert, September 19, includes selections from beloved classical works including Ludwig van Beethoven's Symphony No. 5, Dmitri Shostakovich's Symphony No. 5, and Sergei Prokofiev's *Romeo and Juliet* Suite. Assistant Conductor Stephanie Childress, who leads the orchestra in concerts April 8-10, 2022, leads a selection from Antonín Dvořák's Symphony No. 9, "From the New World."





On September 25-26, concerts open with the first SLSO performances of Jessie Montgomery's *Banner*, which uses motifs from the *The Star-Spangled Banner* to both celebrate and confront the diversity of American experiences from the past and present. Following this, Israeli cellist Inbal Segev makes her SLSO debut in Anna Clyne's *DANCE*, a piece inspired by the poetry of Rumi that includes local dancers choreographed by Center of Creative Arts (COCA) Co-Artistic Director of Dance Kirven Douthit-Boyd. In this performance, Clyne's *DANCE* will be performed for the first time as a multimedia presentation with choreography and dancers from several St. Louis-area companies. Pytor Ilyich Tchaikovsky's Symphony No. 4 closes the concert, bringing an electric urgency to the stage, a triumph and celebration for the season's opening.

On October 1-2, the SLSO begins with the SLSO premiere of *Entr'acte* by Caroline Shaw, the youngest ever Pulitzer Prize winner for music. The piece draws inspiration from a Joseph Haydn quartet. Next is Charles Ives' *The Unanswered Question*, which is structured like a conversation between a trumpet, a woodwind quartet, and a string section, all of whom seek to answer the question of humanity's existence. Then, Christopher Rouse's *Rapture* seeks "spiritual bliss." Finally, the concert closes with Sergei Rachmaninoff's Piano Concerto No. 3, a timeless Romantic piece of great warmth and passion. The concerto will be performed by guest pianist Yefim Bronfman, a friend of the SLSO who last performed with Denève and the orchestra in 2019. He also helped select the SLSO's newest Steinway grand piano with Denève.

The SLSO is following CDC guidelines for COVID safety protocols and is working with St. Louis City and St. Louis County to determine what protocols will be necessary. Details will be shared at slso.org/protocols prior to the concert.
