ST. LOUIS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA ANNOUNCES ADDITIONAL LIVE AT POWELL HALL CONCERTS FOR SPRING 2022

The Music of Pink Floyd celebrates the defining music of the beloved English rock band, February 26, 2022

Genre-bending artist and frequent SLSO collaborator Ben Folds returns for two concerts with the SLSO, April 1-2, 2022

(November 18, 2021, St. Louis, MO) – Today, the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra announced details for additional Live at Powell Hall concerts in spring 2022, including a two-night engagement with singer-songwriter Ben Folds in his fifth appearance with the orchestra and a tribute to the music of powerhouse rock band Pink Floyd.

The Music of Pink Floyd concert is aturday, February 26. The SLSO collaboration with Ben Folds is Friday and Saturday, April 1-2, 2022. Both concerts start at 7:30pm. All concerts take place at historic Powell Hall in the Grand Center Arts District.

Tickets start at \$35 for The Music of Pink Floyd and \$55 for Ben Folds. Tickets are on sale now and can be purchased by visiting <u>slso.org</u> or calling the Box Office at 314-534-1700. Connecting rock n' roll and orchestral music, the Music of Pink Floyd concert (February 26, 2022) pays homage to the British rock band known for its experimental instrumentations and elaborate stage presentations. The SLSO is joined by a rock band, guest conductor Brent Havens, and vocalist Randy Jackson performing Pink Floyd hits including "Money," "Learning to Fly," "Comfortably Numb," and more.

Ben Folds, widely regarded as a major music influencer, returns for two concerts with the SLSO on April 1-2, 2022, as part of his *In Actual Person Live For Real Tour*. For more than a decade, he has performed with some of the world's greatest symphony orchestras, including five separate appearances with the SLSO, most recently in sold-out shows in February 2020.

Since 2010, Live at Powell Hall concerts have included SLSO performances of movie scores including *Harry Potter* and *Jurassic Park*, tribute concerts to artists such as The Beatles and Led Zeppelin, and one-night-only performances by artists including Idina Menzel, Leslie Odom, Jr., Boyz II Men, and John Williams.
