ST. LOUIS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA NAMES JULIE GIBBS VICE PRESIDENT AND CHIEF PHILANTHROPY OFFICER

(January 12, 2022, St. Louis, MO) – Today, St. Louis Symphony Orchestra President and CEO Marie-Hélène Bernard announced the appointment of **Julie Gibbs** as the institution's Vice President and Chief Philanthropy Officer. Gibbs succeeds John Easley, who served in the position on an interim basis since October 2021.

A St. Louis native and graduate of Parkway Central High School and the University of Missouri School of Journalism, Gibbs rejoins the SLSO after previously serving for ten years in marketing and development from 1988 to 1998. Most recently, she served as the Vice President of Development at the Jewish Federation of St. Louis. In that role, Gibbs led the development team, exceeding goals in annual fundraising and planned giving. In her eight years there, she led growth within Women's Philanthropy and helped

create their now signature women's campaign and community event, L'Chaim. She previously held the positions of Director of Major Gifts and Affinity Groups and Director of Women's Philanthropy.

The SLSO recently reported \$7.758 million in philanthropic giving in FY21, which followed two years of record giving by the St. Louis community, with \$8.06 million raised for the Annual Fund in FY20, up from a record \$8.01 million in FY19.
