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ST. LOUIS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA ANNOUNCES 2019/2020 FAMILY CONCERT SERIES WITH SLSO RESIDENT CONDUCTOR GEMMA NEW

New leads the SLSO in Music Without Boundaries (October 6, 2019), *Peter and the Wolf* (February 23, 2020), and World of Water (April 19, 2020)

(March 25, St. Louis, MO) – Today, the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra announced its line-up of Family Concerts for the 2019/2020 season, the orchestra's 140th, with a trio of programs that will take families around the world, into fairy tales, and deep under water – all through music. These three, 45-minute Sunday afternoon concerts, designed for families with children ages 5 to 12, will be conducted by SLSO Resident Conductor Gemma New. The concerts begin at 3:00pm.

On October 6, 2019, the SLSO presents its Music Without Boundaries Family Concert. Presented in partnership with the *World Traveler Gallery* at <u>The Magic House</u>, this concert features music representing cultures from around the world. The SLSO presented Music Without Boundaries to almost 8,000 St. Louis-area students at three Education Concerts in February 2019. Based on the positive response from students and teachers, the SLSO added it to next season's Family series.

Then, on February 23, 2020, the SLSO brings Prokofiev's musical fairy tale, *Peter and the Wolf*, to life. The symphonic fairy tale follows a brave boy, Peter, and his adventures with a duck, bird, cat, and wolf. This tale has introduced thousands of children to classical music since it was first performed in 1936.

On April 19, 2020, the SLSO partners with <u>the St. Louis Aquarium at Union Station</u> to present the World of Water Family Concert. Many composers, from Claude Debussy to Felix Mendelssohn, have found inspiration in water settings. The SLSO explores the deep connections between water and music in this aquatic adventure.

Before each concert, families are invited to Powell Hall for the SLSO's Instrument Playground. Starting at 2:00pm before each Family Concert, guests can explore, touch, and play real instruments of the orchestra in this hands-on experience located in throughout Powell Hall. Additional activities related to the theme of each concert will be announced later.

Gemma New returns to conduct her sixth, seventh, and eighth Family Concerts with the SLSO during the 19/20 season, most recently conducting the *Carnival of the Animals* in March 2019. New has also led the SLSO in two classical subscription programs and leads her third on April 5-7, the annual Forest Park concert, the Mercy Holiday





Celebration, and presentations of *Star Wars: A New Hope* in Concert. She made her New York City Lincoln Center debut conducting the New York Philharmonic at a Young People's Concert in November 2018. She was recently appointed Principal Guest Conductor of the Dallas Symphony Orchestra, a position she will assume in the 19/20 season in addition to her role with the SLSO.

Subscriptions for 19/20 Family Concert series are on sale now and begin at \$27 for adults and \$18 for children. Single tickets will go on sale this summer.
