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ST. LOUIS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA ANNOUNCES 2019/2020 LIVE AT POWELL HALL CONCERTS

Upcoming season features the continued film sagas of Harry Potter and Star Wars, the returns of Ben Folds and Wynton Marsalis and the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra, a tribute to Aretha Franklin, the Music of John Williams, and St. Louis native Kennedy Holmes

(May 15, 2019, St. Louis, MO) – Today, the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra announced the latest additions to its 2019/2020 season, including its annual holiday concerts, IN UNISON Chorus performances, and Live at Powell Hall concerts that include performances of scores of beloved films, special guest artists, and unique tributes.

The historic 19/20 Season marks the orchestra's 140th year and first with Music Director Stéphane Denève. The Live at Powell Hall and Holiday concerts complement the SLSO's classical concerts, which include performances of Beethoven's Ninth, Stravinsky's *The Rite of Spring*, and Gershwin's *An American in Paris*, as well as the Family Concert Series and Live at the Pulitzer performances – more than 100 concerts in all throughout the season. Single tickets for classical, family, and Pulitzer concerts go on sale in July.

Since 2010, the SLSO has hosted more than 150 Live at Powell Hall concerts: from movies like *Singin'* in the *Rain, Harry Potter*, and *Jurassic Park*, to tribute concerts and one-night-only performances with award-winning guests including Boyz II Men, Wyclef Jean, Leslie Odom Jr., and Idina Menzel.

Denève and the SLSO will present an evening of film music by his friend, Academy Award-winning composer John Williams, to open the season September 13-15. Denève also leads the annual BMO Wealth Management New Year's Eve Celebration, a night of fun musical surprises that has become a St. Louis tradition (December 31).

Taking Powell Hall back to its theater roots, the SLSO will perform scores alongside four films throughout the season, including *Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince* in Concert (October 25-27), *Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back* in Concert (January 23-26, 2020), and *Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows, Part 1* in concert (March 20-22, 2020). Performances of *Home Alone*, the holiday favorite, return to the SLSO on December 20-21, following four sold-out performances in December 2018.

This fall, the SLSO will perform a touching tribute to the Queen of Soul, the late Aretha Franklin, featuring members of the SLSO's IN UNISON Chorus (October 11). And just in time for Valentine's Day, audience favorite and frequent SLSO collaborator Ben Folds returns for a special two-night engagement (February 13-14, 2020). Folds has performed with the orchestra three times in the past eight years – all sell-out engagements.





Holidays at Powell Hall

The holiday season gets off to a swinging start with Wynton Marsalis and the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra visiting Powell Hall as part of their national Big Band Holidays tour (December 4). While the SLSO will not appear as part of this concert, Marsalis and the Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra are longtime collaborators with the orchestra, having last appeared with the SLSO in May 2018 to perform and record Marsalis' *Swing Symphony*.

The festivities continue as the SLSO offers six performances of the beloved Mercy Holiday Celebration (December 13-15). The SLSO is joined by vocalist Rachel Potter and the Holiday Festival Chorus – made up of high school students from across the bi-state region – for performances featuring timeless classics, carols, familiar favorites, and Santa Claus.

Kevin McBeth will lead A Gospel Christmas, featuring the SLSO IN UNISON Chorus (December 19). Joining the program this year is Kennedy Holmes, the St. Louis native and finalist last year on NBC's *The Voice*.

Lift Every Voice Concert

After performing with Denève and the SLSO at the Forest Park concert in September and at A Gospel Christmas, the IN UNISON Chorus returns for the annual Lift Every Voice: A Black History Month Celebration (February 21, 2020). Led by IN UNISON Chorus Director Kevin McBeth, the chorus celebrated its 25th anniversary last season.

Stéphane Denève, Music Director Designate

Stéphane Denève currently is Music Director Designate for the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, Music Director of the Brussels Philharmonic, Principal Guest Conductor of The Philadelphia Orchestra, and Director of the Centre for Future Orchestral Repertoire (CffOR). He will become Music Director of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra in the 2019/2020 season.

Recognized internationally for the exceptional quality of his performances and programming, Denève regularly appears at major concert venues with the world's greatest orchestras and soloists. He has a special affinity for the music of his native France and is a passionate advocate for music of the 21st century. A gifted communicator and educator, he is committed to inspiring the next generation of musicians and listeners and has worked regularly with young people in the programs such as those of the Tanglewood Music Center, New World Symphony, the Colburn School, and the Music Academy of the West.

He is a frequent guest with leading orchestras such as the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra, Orchestra Sinfonica dell'Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia, The Cleveland Orchestra, Los Angeles Philharmonic, San Francisco Symphony, New York Philharmonic, Toronto Symphony, Orchestre National de France, Vienna Symphony, DSO Berlin and NHK Symphony.

As a recording artist, he has won critical acclaim for his recordings of the works of Poulenc, Debussy, Ravel, Roussel, Franck, and Honegger. He is a triple winner of the Diapason d'Or of the Year, has been shortlisted for Gramophone's Artist of the Year Award, and has won the prize for symphonic music at the International Classical Music Awards. His most recent releases include discs of Prokofiev suites and the works of Guillaume Connesson with Brussels Philharmonic, as well as recordings with Lucas and Arthur Jussen and the Royal Concertgebouw





Orchestra, all for Deutsche Grammophon.

A sought-after artistic partner by preeminent musicians and composers from across the globe, as well as by local and national organizations, the SLSO enjoys a long history of robust and enduring artistic collaborations that have developed and deepened over the years.

Today, the SLSO builds on the institution's current momentum on all fronts, including artistic, financial, audience growth, and community impact, and looks toward the future with Stéphane Denève.
