ST. LOUIS BLUES PARTNER WITH ST. LOUIS SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA TO HOST NATIONAL ANTHEM AUDITIONS FOR THIRD YEAR

Winner to perform at an upcoming Blues home game during 2019/2020 season, join rotation of Blues Anthem singers

(July 22, 2019, St. Louis, MO) – Today, the Stanley Cup Champion St. Louis Blues and St. Louis Symphony Orchestra announced the return of their National Anthem contest to showcase the talent of St. Louisans at a Blues home game during the 2019/2020 season. This marks the third year of this collaborative partnership, which will give a soloist or small group an opportunity to perform the National Anthem prior to a Blues game.

Performers of all ages are encouraged to enter, including soloists, vocal performing groups, instrumentalists, and small instrumental groups. To be considered for an audition, performers must first submit an online video entry at http://bit.ly/32MPxhd before Friday, August 16, at noon. Finalists will be invited to an in-person audition at Powell Hall to perform live in front of a panel of judges. The blind auditions are structured the same way musicians audition for the SLSO.

The Blues and its long-time National Anthem singer Charles Glenn made headlines around the world this year as the Blues made their improbable run for the Stanley Cup. Glenn, who announced his retirement as full-time Blues Anthem singer in January, is excited to help select another singer to perform at Blues games.

Auditions will be judged by Glenn, Director of the St. Louis Symphony IN UNISON Chorus Kevin McBeth, Kennedy Holmes – St. Louis native and fourth-place finisher on Season 15 of NBC's hit show *The Voice*, James Bertels – a winner in the inaugural contest, and an SLSO musician. The game at which the winner will perform will be announced at a later date.

Last year, more than 100 performers entered the contest and more than 30 were invited to the final auditions, held at Powell Hall. Matt Pentecost, 34, a music teacher in the Maplewood-Richmond Heights School District, was named the winner.
