Orchestra's 140th season, which runs from September 2019 to May 2020, crafted by Denève as musical gift to St. Louis

(July 24, 2019, St. Louis, MO) – Today, single tickets for an extraordinary new era of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra's storied history go on sale, celebrating the inaugural season with Music Director Stéphane Denève. This



milestone 2019/2020 season, the orchestra's 140th, was designed by Denève, the SLSO's 13th Music Director, and includes a wide variety of concerts, including classical mainstays, exciting music of our time, presentations of film scores with movies projected on the big screen, special one-night-only performances with renowned guests, family-centered concerts, holiday concerts, and innovative concert experiences.

Stéphane Denève

Denève shaped the 19/20 season around an Arch of Franco-American musical friendship, paying homage to St. Louis' most enduring symbol and exploring the deep relationships between French and American music. He brings to St. Louis a robust

variety of world-renowned artists to perform cornerstone works by Beethoven, Berlioz, and Ravel, along with newer works by 16 composers of today.

Additional 19/20 season highlights include:

- Three world premieres and a U.S. premiere
- Three concert programs and a recital with Denève's close friend and collaborator, the Jean-Paul and Isabelle Montupet SLSO Artist-In-Residence, <u>pianist Jean-Yves Thibaudet</u>
- New friendships with 23 renowned conductors and artists making their St. Louis debuts
- Solo performances by five members of the SLSO family, including: Jelena Dirks (Principal Oboe), Kristin Ahlstrom (Associate Principal Second Violin), Angie Smart (First Violin), Andrea Kaplan (Associate Principal Flute), and David Halen (Concertmaster)
- Performances of six film scores, including: Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince, Home Alone, Beauty and the Beast, Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back, Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows Part 1, and Raiders of the Lost Ark

During the 19/20 season, which runs from September 2019 through May 2020, the SLSO will present approximately 110 live performances at Powell Hall through various series: Classical, Live at Powell Hall, IN UNISON, Education Concerts, Family Concerts, and Holidays at Powell. In addition, the SLSO presents St. Louis Symphony Live at the Pulitzer, a four-program series at the Pulitzer Arts Foundation. SLSO musicians also perform more than 75 free programs in the community each season, actively engaging audiences in schools, parks, hospitals, nursing homes, and other public spaces throughout the region.

About Stéphane Denève, Music Director

Stéphane Denève will assume the title of Music Director of the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra in the 2019/2020 season. He is also the Music Director of the Brussels Philharmonic, Principal Guest Conductor of The Philadelphia Orchestra, and Director of the Centre for Future Orchestral Repertoire (CffOR).

Recognized internationally for the exceptional quality of his performances and programming, Denève regularly appears at major concert venues with the world's greatest orchestras and soloists. He has a special affinity for the music of his native France, and is a passionate advocate for music of the 21st century. A gifted communicator and educator, he is committed to inspiring the next generation of musicians and listeners, and has worked regularly with young people in the programs such as those of the Tanglewood Music Center, New World Symphony, the Colburn School, and the Music Academy of the West.

He is a frequent guest with leading orchestras such as the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra, Orchestra Sinfonica dell'Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia, The Cleveland Orchestra, Los Angeles Philharmonic, San Francisco Symphony, New York Philharmonic, Toronto Symphony, Orchestre National de France, Vienna Symphony, DSO Berlin and NHK Symphony. The 18/19 season will also see him lead a major US tour with the Brussels Philharmonic. In the field of opera, Stéphane Denève has led productions at the Royal Opera House, Glyndebourne Festival, La Scala, Deutsche Oper Berlin, Saito Kinen Festival, Gran Teatro de Liceu, Netherlands Opera, La Monnaie, Deutsche Oper Am Rhein, and at the Opéra National de Paris.

As a recording artist, he has won critical acclaim for his recordings of the works of Poulenc, Debussy, Ravel, Roussel, Franck and Honegger. He is a triple winner of the Diapason d'Or of the Year, has been shortlisted for

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Gramophone's Artist of the Year Award, and has won the prize for symphonic music at the International Classical Music Awards. His most recent releases include discs of Prokofiev suites and the works of Guillaume Connesson with Brussels Philharmonic, as well as recordings with Lucas and Arthur Jussen and the Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra, all for Deutsche Grammophon.
